

### You are invited on March 13, 2024, Community Engagement Session for the new Admin-Legislature Facility Project

### **Background:**

Executive Council has prioritized the design and construction of a new building that will house TFN's adminstration offices and the Legislative Assembly.

This facility will be located along Fisherman Way, see map below:



- A Project Steering Committee was appointed by the Chief to provide strategic oversight of the project and has
  already met several times, including conducting a site visit and completed two tours (along with Legislators and staff)
  of existing facilities within the indigenous and non-indigenous communities in the Metro Vancouver/Fraser Valley
  areas.
- The functional programming for the facility was completed by Resource Planning Group (RPG).
- The project architect from Urban Arts Architecture Inc. has development high-level concepts through an iterative process.
- On Feb 20, 2024, there was an update and discussion at the 2024 spring legislature on high level concepts about
  design elements such: site planning, access, parking, building form, orientation, landscaped areas, location of TFN
  offices and the legislature with all the supportive elements, etc. The building is likely to be approximately 50,000
  sq.ft. in size which includes the Legislature portion (approx. 11,000 sq.ft.).
- Next steps include seek community feedback and discuss at the Steering Committee meeting, EC will endorse a
  preferred concept and the Schematic Design phase will begin in April 2024. Most of this year will involve design
  development through the schematic and detailed design phases.

### WHO WE ARE

The Environmental Emergency Program (EEP) leads the Province's response to hazardous material spills and other environmental emergencies.

### **SPILL MANAGEMENT IN B.C.**

The purpose of EEP is to plan for, coordinate, implement and manage a program to protect the welfare of the public and environment in the event of an environmental emergency or disaster. EEP's mission is to protect and enhance the quality of B.C.'s water, land, and air in a way that contributes to healthy communities, a sustainable environment, and a strong, vibrant provincial economy.

Environmental emergency management is a shared responsibility. Coordination between governments, First Nations, industry, and communities before, during and after a spill will help to minimize impacts to the environment and communities.

EEP receives approximately 5,000 reports of spills and other environmental emergencies annually. A key tenet of the regulatory regime in B.C. is the polluter-pay principle. Monitoring a spiller's compliance with regulatory requirements is a key responsibility of EEP.

### Re: <u>Construction Notification: George Massey Tunnel Reversible Lane Control System Upgrade</u>

Please be advised of upcoming traffic pattern changes to complete an upgrade to the George Massey Tunnel's reversible lane control system, now underway until the end of April. The work will require manually implementing counterflow lanes during peak travel periods for four weeks and one weekend of full overnight closures of the George Massey Tunnel and approaches.

Highway 99 is a key connection for communities on both sides of the Fraser River and a vital trade route. Improvements to the George Massey Tunnel's reversible lane control system are needed to help maintain capacity, reliability and safety for all travellers on Highway 99. The system upgrade involves installing new overhead lane control signals, cameras, swing gate controls and electrical connections to the Ministry's power infrastructure.

The upgrade work has been scheduled to minimize traffic disruption and delay as much as possible; however, delays can be expected. The anticipated schedule of construction activities includes:

### Manual Counterflow - March 11 to April 4, 2024

- From March 11 to April 4 the existing lane control system will be taken offline. Overhead lane control lights will not be visible during this period.
- Work crews will be on-site to manually install the counterflow lanes during the a.m. and p.m. peaks.
- The manual counterflow will be in place from approximately 5:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. on weekdays (same as existing times).
- Trucks with flashing lights, message boards and lane control posts will be in place to guide traffic leading up to and within the tunnel.
- While traffic may slow during the changeover process, once the counterflow lanes are open, traffic flow will resume as normal.
- During non-counterflow times, two lanes will be open in each direction and transition lanes will be closed.


### George Massey Tunnel Overnight Closures - April 4 to April 8, 2024

- To complete the transition to the new system, a weekend nighttime full closure of the tunnel and approaches will take place, tentatively scheduled for April 4 to April 8, 2024.
- Motorists will be encouraged to follow detour signs to use the Alex Fraser Bridge as an alternative route. A map of the proposed detour route is on the next page.
- The detour will be in place nightly until 5 a.m. Detour start times depend on the direction of travel, as shown in the detour map.
- During these hours, the George Massey Tunnel will be closed to all traffic, except for emergency vehicles and late-night busses.
- Measures will be in place to help reduce congestion and keep traffic moving as much as possible along the detour route, however, some delays can be expected.





The North Neighbourhood Plan designates the approximately 8 hectare (20 acres) of Precinct B1 as 'Tourist Commercial'. Executive Group (Developer) is proposing a Neighbourhood Plan amendment to accommodate a proposed Hotel, Apartment and Townhouse residential development while retaining the existing waterpark. 




