15-Year Treaty Review Engagement | Tsawwassen First Nation

What We Heard

In April 2024, Tsawwassen First Nation will celebrate the 15-year anniversary of the Tsawwassen Treaty!

This milestone is the first opportunity to conduct a Periodic Review, as set out in Chapter 23 of the Treaty. To better understand how the Treaty can be improved, TFN staff conducted a variety of engagements with Tsawwassen Members and Tsawwassen Government staff from November 2023 - March 2024.

- Strengthen TFN stewardship rights
- Enhance fish and crab allocations
- Improve management of Joint Fisheries Committee
- TFN-determined Membership eligibility
- Improve consultation and collaboration with Canada, BC, and Metro Vancouver
- Include the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples

TERRITORY RIGHTS & NATURAL **RESOURCES**



- Member hunting allocations Territory & BC
- Improve reasonable opportunity harvesting requirement
- Increase jurisdiction over environmental assessments



& HERITAGE



- Increase revenue sharing requirements -Canada & BC
- Federal & provincial procurement to include Member businesses
- Tax exemption all Tsawwassen Lands
- Remove own source revenue requirements

- Process for the Addition of Lands and Water Lots
- Agricultural Land Reserve Exemption
- Clarify and improve the jurisdiction and building of homes
- Strengthen Hun'qum'i'num language status in Treaty
- TFN jurisdiction over cemetery operations
- Strengthen requirements on Tsawwassen artifacts & ancestral remains

These items are subject to negotiation with Canada & BC and may not result in a Treaty amendment.

Re: <u>Construction Notification: George Massey Tunnel Reversible Lane Control System Upgrade</u>

Please be advised of upcoming traffic pattern changes to complete an upgrade to the George Massey Tunnel's reversible lane control system, now underway until the end of April. The work will require manually implementing counterflow lanes during peak travel periods for four weeks and one weekend of full overnight closures of the George Massey Tunnel and approaches.

Highway 99 is a key connection for communities on both sides of the Fraser River and a vital trade route. Improvements to the George Massey Tunnel's reversible lane control system are needed to help maintain capacity, reliability and safety for all travellers on Highway 99. The system upgrade involves installing new overhead lane control signals, cameras, swing gate controls and electrical connections to the Ministry's power infrastructure.

The upgrade work has been scheduled to minimize traffic disruption and delay as much as possible; however, delays can be expected. The anticipated schedule of construction activities includes:

Manual Counterflow - March 11 to April 4, 2024

- From March 11 to April 4 the existing lane control system will be taken offline. Overhead lane control lights will not be visible during this period.
- Work crews will be on-site to manually install the counterflow lanes during the a.m. and p.m. peaks.
- The manual counterflow will be in place from approximately 5:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. on weekdays (same as existing times).
- Trucks with flashing lights, message boards and lane control posts will be in place to guide traffic leading up to and within the tunnel.
- While traffic may slow during the changeover process, once the counterflow lanes are open, traffic flow will resume as normal.
- During non-counterflow times, two lanes will be open in each direction and transition lanes will be closed.


George Massey Tunnel Overnight Closures - April 4 to April 8, 2024

- To complete the transition to the new system, a weekend nighttime full closure of the tunnel and approaches will take place, tentatively scheduled for April 4 to April 8, 2024.
- Motorists will be encouraged to follow detour signs to use the Alex Fraser Bridge as an alternative route. A map of the proposed detour route is on the next page.
- The detour will be in place nightly until 5 a.m. Detour start times depend on the direction of travel, as shown in the detour map.
- During these hours, the George Massey Tunnel will be closed to all traffic, except for emergency vehicles and late-night busses.
- Measures will be in place to help reduce congestion and keep traffic moving as much as possible along the detour route, however, some delays can be expected.



INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL CLAIMANTS MAY CHOOSE TO SHARE THEIR RECORDS OR KEEP THEM CONFIDENTIAL

If you made a claim in the Indian Residential Schools Independent Assessment Process (IAP) or Alternate Dispute Resolution Process (ADR), you have choices:

- Do nothing: your records will remain confidential and then will be destroyed on September 19, 2027
- Get a copy for yourself to keep or share with others
- Preserve your records at the NCTR for history, education and research
- Get a copy for yourself <u>and also</u> preserve your records at the NCTR for history, education and research





TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY OF FALCON WAY

Dear Resident,

TFN has engaged Aplin & Martin Geomatics Land Surveying Ltd. to conduct a topographic survey of the following streets and property frontages as part of the Falcon Way Streetscape Design improvements:

- 1. Falcon Way between Tsawwassen Drive and 2500 block;
- 2. Falcon Court;
- 3. Pheasant Lane;
- 4. Heron Place.

Survey elevation data are critical for assessments of Sea-Level Rise and coastal flooding exposure, as well as ensuring that future roadworks will be aesthetically pleasing and integrate smoothly with existing properties. As part of the survey, Aplin & Martin survey crew will be walking around and taking survey shots of:

- 1. Ground elevations along the property line fronting roads listed above;
- 2. Driveway widths and elevations up to a building, garage location;
- 3. Fences;
