





Are you interested in learning to speak həńqəminəm?

Do you want to enhance your language skills for personal or professional objectives? Whether your knowledge of həńqəmińəm is beginning or advanced, you are welcome to participate in this program. This full-time program is for people who wish to acquire fluency and literacy in həńqəmińəm, while also learning technical and other skills needed for becoming language/culture instructors, language revitalizers, language researchers, and materials developers. The two-term certificate program is followed by a one-year diploma program, and all credits can be applied to a BA degree with minors in Indigenous Languages and Linguistics.

Our language courses make use of immersion methods and story work to help make language learning fun. Our team of instructors guide you through pronunciation, word architecture, and sentence building to deepen your understanding of the language. Reconciliation and Treaty Implementation in action: Tsawwassen First Nation adds lands to Tsawwassen jurisdiction

April 25, 2024

Tsawwassen, BC – Tsawwassen First Nation (TFN) is in the process of incorporating 11 parcels of lands contiguous with the Treaty settlement boundary, to Tsawwassen jurisdiction.

The incorporation of these lands demonstrates how treaty implementation can be an effective means of reconciliation. The Tsawwassen First Nation Final Agreement, signed by TFN, the Government of Canada, and the Province of BC, and effective April 3, 2009, sets out the process for TFN to acquire and incorporate specified lands near Brunswick Point, that were historically governed by TFN prior to colonization. Brunswick Point is deeply rooted in the history, culture and heritage of the Tsawwassen First Nation and continues to connect the Tsawwassen Peoples to our ancestors, stories, lands, and waters that sustain our community and life.

The 11 parcels are owned by TFN and are currently under the jurisdiction of the City of Delta and within the Agriculture Land Reserve (ALR). While the jurisdiction of the parcels will change to TFN after the incorporation, the lands will remain in the ALR. Agriculture is culturally linked to TFN, as is the importance of access to local foods.

Tsawwassen First Nation is working with the lessees of the parcels and looks forward to establishing long term relationships, rooted in shared values around food security and sustainability. Discussions are underway to ensure servicing is unhindered and unchanged by the transition by working closely with the City of Delta. Following the incorporation of the parcels to Tsawwassen Lands, TFN will assume jurThe isdiction, including property taxation, laws, and regulations.

"The Tsawwassen People have lived and governed these lands since time immemorial. As šxwkwecxənəm, which in our language means "lookout" or stewards, it is very important for the Nation to provide stewardship of these lands, to exercise our established Treaty rights, and to maintain our connection to the Land and culture, which is at the heart of who we are." said Chief sxwamisaat Laura Cassidy.

We believe that through respectful cooperation, we can ensure a smooth transition for residents and strengthen our relationship with the Tsawwassen First Nation," said Mayor George Harvie, City of Delta.

To incorporate the lands, Tsawwassen First Nation is closely collaborating with TFN's Treaty Partners, Canada, and BC. TFN will also work closely with regional stakeholders through this process, including the City of Delta and Metro Vancouver.

Tsawwassen Foreshore Fieldwork: MAY - JULY 2024

Field work for the Coastal Flood Risk Adaptation Strategy feasibility study will be taking place over the next several months. This work will include assessments of the breakwater and sea dikes, plant and environmental surveys as well as Geotechnical testing. Geotechnical testing will occur on Tsawwassen Lands north of Deltaport Way and on TFN owned property along River Road.

This field work will inform the writing of a report that will be used to help guide the community in deciding what Coastal Flood Risk Adaptation Strategy TFN should follow to mitigate the risk from sea level rise caused by climate change.

Dear TFN members and residents:

This is a reminder that Stage 1 watering restrictions will be in effect from May 1 until October 15, 2024 as outlined in *Metro Vancouver's Drinking Water Conservation Plan*.

Stage 1 comes into effect automatically each year to manage the use of drinking water during periods of high demand, water shortages, and emergencies.

Reducing lawn watering remains the most effective way to ensure we are using our drinking water wisely during the summer months when demand is highest and rainfall is lowest. One morning per week provides adequate watering time to maintain a healthy lawn and achieve further water use reductions. Watering trees, shrubs and flowers is permitted any day of the week.

Successful conservation across the region will help us to continue to deliver drinking water to the increasing number of people who call Metro Vancouver home. Additionally, sustainable lawn care and landscaping practices can help residents prepare for changing weather patterns, to continue to enjoy their green spaces.







Notice of Work Geotechnical Investigation on Falcon Way



Re: Falcon Way, Tsawwassen, BC – Construction Activities – May 8, 2024

This letter is to inform you of the upcoming geotechnical subsurface investigation that will be occurring along Falcon Way in Tsawwassen, BC, between Tsawwassen Drive and the north end of Falcon Way (See Figure 1).



Figure 1: Approximate Work Area

GeoWest Engineering Ltd. will be conducting a subsurface soil investigation that will involve non-destructive utility locating and drilling with a truck mounted Auger drill rig. Dynamic Cone Penetration Tests (DCPTs) will be conducted adjacent to the auger hole locations to assess the in-situ relative density/consistency of the soil, as deemed necessary by GeoWest field personnel. The auger holes / DCPTs will be extended to depths ranging from 3m to 9m below existing grade, or to practical refusal if encountered at a shallower depth.

Traffic control will be implemented to direct the oncoming traffic around the work area, while the work is being conducted. Access to the properties adjacent to the roadway will be maintained. The work will be completed on May 8, 2024, between the hours of 7:00 am and 4:00 pm.
