












Recognizing National Indigenous History Month and National Indigenous Peoples Day

In Canada, June is National Indigenous History Month and June 21 is National Indigenous Peoples Day. This is a time for Canadians to celebrate the unique heritage, diverse cultures, and outstanding contributions of First Nations, Inuit, and Metis peoples.

Learning about Indigenous Peoples is a key step in building a successful path to reconciliation. In doing so, we at the port authority strengthen our ability to build more meaningful relationships with local First Nation communities.

This month, the port authority is holding an employee event to recognize and celebrate the cultures and contributions of Indigenous Peoples of Canada. The event will include music, performances, and important messages from special guests who will be joining us from Musqueam Indian Band, Squamish Nation, Tsleil-Waututh Nation, and Tsawwassen First Nation. Roberts Bank Terminal 2 updates

Species at Risk Act-compliant Fisheries Act Authorization application update

In consultation with First Nations, we are advancing our application for a *Species at Risk Act* (SARA)-compliant *Fisheries Act* authorization (FAA) for the Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project. In the coming weeks, we will be sharing the full draft application with First Nations for review. This is a result of many years of consultation, knowledge sharing, and collaboration, and we are grateful to First Nations for their meaningful input and involvement. We have revised this version of the application to reflect First Nation comments received over the past year on draft sections, as well as through meetings and workshops. We have highlighted changes for ease of review and are responding directly to Nations on their feedback.

Following First Nations' review of the full draft application, we will submit the revised final application to Fisheries and Oceans Canada in approximately September 2024.

Update on the western sandpiper follow-up program

To monitor the potential effects of the project on western sandpipers and biofilm (a layer of predominately organic substances that coats many intertidal mudflats and is eaten by western sandpipers), we are developing the western sandpiper follow-up program, per federal project conditions #10.4 and #10.5.

To advance this program, we developed the western sandpiper follow-up program monitoring design in 2023, including the first three study component designs—salinity, biofilm availability, and western sandpiper diet—in consultation with First Nations, regulators, and external experts. Comments received during consultation have been considered and integrated into the <u>revised documents</u>, which have since been provided to the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada for the independent scientific body's review.

We are now developing the remaining study component designs, including energy intake, foraging distribution and intensity, and abundance. Drafts of these study component designs will be made available for review by First Nations, regulators, and external experts in the summer or fall of 2024.

Did you know?

We have been conducting monitoring programs focused on western sandpipers, biofilm, and salinity at Roberts Bank for more than 10 years, with participation from First Nations during field work. In spring 2023, we carried out more field work and conducted a pilot study to test the feasibility of using drones to count and map western sandpipers' droppings. This data—along with consultation feedback from First Nations, Environment and Climate Change Canada, and international experts—is helping to develop the western sandpiper follow-up program.

Sharing the results of the crab baiting away pilot study

In response to feedback from Musqueam Indian Band concerning the potential for crab injury and mortality due to physical handling during pre-construction salvaging, we undertook a crab baiting away pilot study in spring 2023. The objective was to determine whether Dungeness crabs can be attracted and kept away from construction areas using bait alone—without trapping—to reduce handling. The study was collaboratively designed with First Nations, and we are grateful for the knowledge, input, and experience shared with us. The results of this study will inform whether this methodology can be used as a construction mitigation measure during construction as an alternative to a traditional salvage, per federal project condition #7.6.

At multi-Nation workshops in May 2024, we shared a presentation on this study and sought input and feedback. We will be updating the crab baiting away pilot study report to reflect further feedback from First Nations and will be including it as an appendix in the full draft SARA-compliant FAA application for review. We look forward to any additional feedback you may have before the final application is submitted.

Port authority updates

Updates on the ECHO Program

Launched by the port authority in 2014, the Enhancing Cetacean Habitat and Observation (ECHO) Program is a world-leading, regional collaborative initiative to better understand and reduce the cumulative effects of commercial shipping on at-risk whales off B.C.'s southern coast.

In 2023, the ECHO Program's voluntary measures reduced underwater noise by about one-half in key areas of importance to the whales and reduced strike risk by up to about one-third. The program also saw all-time-high participation rates, with operators on 87% of all large commercial ship transits voluntarily reducing their speed or moving away from key areas of SRKW critical habitat.

Recent announcements:

- April 2024: the port authority published the <u>2023 annual report</u> for the ECHO Program
- May 2024: the Government of Canada renewed a <u>Species at Risk Act conservation agreement</u> with
 the port authority and industry partners for five years, which formalizes the role of the ECHO Program
 and partners, and will provide \$3.2 million over two years to the port authority to continue the ECHO
 Program (see photo below)
- June 2024: the ECHO Program <u>launched its eighth season</u> of large-scale threat reduction measures to support the recovery of at-risk whales like the endangered SRKW

We thank the ECHO Program's many partners and advisors from across government, the marine transportation industry, First Nations communities, and environmental groups in Canada and the U.S. With their ongoing support—and the voluntary participation of more than 100 marine transportation organizations—the ECHO Program is continuing to help create quieter and safer oceans for at-risk whales.

About Robert Banks Terminal 2

Led by the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority, Roberts Bank Terminal 2 is a future marine container terminal in Delta, B.C. that will deliver timely capacity to meet Canada's rapidly growing trade needs and provide critical supply chain support. The project was approved by the federal government in April 2023, received an environmental assessment certificate from the provincial government in September 2023, and requires other regulatory approvals and permits before construction can begin.



Dear TFN members and residents:

This is a reminder that Stage 1 watering restrictions will be in effect from May 1 until October 15, 2024 as outlined in *Metro Vancouver's Drinking Water Conservation Plan*.

Stage 1 comes into effect automatically each year to manage the use of drinking water during periods of high demand, water shortages, and emergencies.

Reducing lawn watering remains the most effective way to ensure we are using our drinking water wisely during the summer months when demand is highest and rainfall is lowest. One morning per week provides adequate watering time to maintain a healthy lawn and achieve further water use reductions. Watering trees, shrubs and flowers is permitted any day of the week.

Successful conservation across the region will help us to continue to deliver drinking water to the increasing number of people who call Metro Vancouver home. Additionally, sustainable lawn care and landscaping practices can help residents prepare for changing weather patterns, to continue to enjoy their green spaces.








Below are elevation drawings detailing the dimensions of the window areas available for the "Windows film".


Window area #1 (front windows –facing south)






