#### **TFN Secondary Suite Grant**

#### **Program Criteria & Applicant Selection Process**

#### 1. Program Background:

Building a Secondary Suite within exiting TFN Member homes has been identified as a way to provide additional housing for Members and their families on TFN Lands, or/and to act as a mortgage helper and extra income by renting the units. A Secondary Suite, in accordance with the TFN Zoning Regulation, is a self-contained, accessory dwelling unit located within a principal single-detached dwelling or in an accessory building on the same parcel as a single-detached dwelling. A Secondary Suite has its own separate cooking, sleeping and bathing facilities. It has direct access to the outside without passing through any part of the principal unit.

Through funding from CMHC's Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF) Program, TFN is providing five grants for building Secondary Suites within the TFN Community Area. The grants will provide up to \$50,000 per unit for a total of five units to offset some of the costs of building a Secondary Suite on TFN Members' properties between 2024 to 2026 (the "Grant").

- 2. Purpose of the Criteria & Applicant Selection Process: This criteria and applicant selection process will be used to ensure a fair and unbiased method for selecting and allocating the grants to Member recipients. This program criteria will be applied consistently by staff to all applicants, eliminating any political or family pressures from the process. This document will be made available to applicants who inquire about the selection process.
- **3.** Eligibility Criteria and Selection Method: The criteria and process in this section will be used to make decisions regarding the selection of applications for building a Secondary Suite on Member lots located within TFN Community Area Lands.

#### Mandatory Criteria for Eligibility

- 1. Applicant must be a Tsawwassen Member, 19 years old or older on the date of the application. For clarity:
  - a. An applicant may not apply on behalf of another person;
  - b. If the property is owned by two or more Members, they must apply together.
- 2. Applicants must only apply once with respect to their own property within the TFN Community Area which is their Primary Residence<sup>1</sup>.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> A Primary Residence is the home where an individual lives, makes their home, and conducts their daily affairs without limitation. It is the residential address that is used for the government-issued identifications, taxation and insurance purposes.

3. Members must be prepared to complete building the Secondary Suite by the end of December 2026. At the time of the Application, Members must provide a summary of the project, project budget and evidence of financial capacity to complete the project (i.e. through bank statements, mortgage approval, etc.) to the satisfaction of staff.

#### Process to Select Applicants

#### Step 1: Application

 Members apply by submitting a complete Application Form including project summary, project budget, and financial evidence. Waitlist will open in October 2024, at TFN Members Gathering. The time of application opening will be communicated with Members through TFN's Community Notice and Newsletter in advance of Members Gathering.

#### Step 2: Waitlist Creation

• Eligibility will be determined on a first come first served basis (i.e., the first person to apply, provided they meet the eligibility criteria, is the first person on the waitlist).

#### **Step 3: Confirmation of Eligibility**

• Following the deadline date, staff confirm if all mandatory criteria have been met for each Member applicant.

#### **Step 4: Finalize List of Recipients**

- The first five Member applicants on the list who meet the eligibility criteria are the list of recipients, maintained in the same order as their application was received.
- Any Member applicant who does not meet all eligibility criteria is skipped over but retains their
  placement on the list for any secondary rounds of allocation, if all the Grant funding is not
  allocated in the first round.

#### Step 5: Entering into a Funding Agreement

- Once the applicants received notice of Grant approval to build a Secondary Suite, they must meet with the TFN Housing Staff to discuss their project's next steps. They must review the "Secondary Suite – How to Build Guide" which provides detailed information on obtaining permits and building steps.
- Members will enter into a Funding Agreement, agreeing to utilize the Grant for building the Secondary Suite and to proceed with the project within six months of the Grant approval or else the funding will be revoked. Members also agree to complete the project by the end of 2026.

#### Step 6: Receiving Grant

• Grants will be provided to recipients through reimbursement of direct costs, once a Building Permit has been obtained.



• Should any Member applicant decline or fail to obtain a Building Permit for a Secondary Suite within six months of being approved for the Grant, the Grant will be revoked and the next Member applicant on the list to meet all criteria will be selected to receive the Grant.

### **OPPORTUNITY TO SERVE ON TFN'S JUDICIAL COUNCIL**

Executive Council is seeking TFN Member applicants for a vacancy on the Judicial Council. The TFN Judicial Council is appointed by Executive Council to 5-year terms, pursuant to the *Administrative Review and Judicial Proceedings Act*. The TFN Member position on the Judicial Council recently became vacant when Andrew Bak, who was appointed to the position in 2022, stepped down after accepting a staff position within the TFN Administration and was no longer eligible to serve on the Council.

The Judicial Council meets as required, in accordance with the instructions of the Chair of the Judicial Council, and has the following responsibilities:

- determining the validity of Tsawwassen laws,
- resolving disputes between Tsawwassen Members and elected officials,
- making recommendations to courts on the sentencing of Tsawwassen Members, if requested,
- investigating any financial irregularities that may occur,
- hearing appeals of administrative decisions,
- resolving disputes between Tsawwassen Members,
- resolving disputes between government bodies, and
- other duties that Executive Council may assign to it from time to time under any Tsawwassen enactment.

The hourly rate of pay for the TFN Member appointee is \$75 per hour.

All TFN Members are eligible to apply, however, you may not concurrently sit on Judicial Council and hold any other office with Tsawwassen Government or collect fees or a salary from Tsawwassen Government.

#### Expression of Interest to become a Member of a new Periodic Review Advisory Group

The *Tsawwassen First Nation Final Agreement* (the "Treaty") includes an opportunity for a Periodic Review every 15 years. The review is a chance to talk about what's working and what's not and seek changes to the Treaty where it makes sense to do so.

In Fall-Winter 2023-2024, Policy & Intergovernmental Affairs ("PIGA") Staff held family meetings and other community engagements to hear from you about what's most important for the Periodic Treaty Review. Discussions with BC and Canada started in April 2024.

In support of the Periodic Review, TFN is seeking Tsawwassen Members that are interested in advising the PIGA department as a member of the Periodic Review Advisory Group (the "Advisory Group"). The purpose of the Advisory Group is to provide in-depth feedback and guidance to PIGA staff on Member views of specific topics, as well as how best to include the rest of the Tsawwassen community. The Advisory Group will consist of approximately eight to ten Tsawwassen Members who represent a variety of interests and experience.

Description of work: Members of the Advisory Group are expected to meet once per month and:

- provide input to PIGA on topics that are being discussed during the Periodic Review, including Member views and experiences, and guidance on PIGA's approach for items at the discussion table;
- advise PIGA on how best to engage the community on the Periodic Review, including how to report back and provide updates; and
- practice confidentiality on specific topics that are being discussed and actively negotiated during the Periodic Review.

The proposed term of the Advisory Group is approximately 1 year, and an extension is dependent on the Periodic Review process. Advisory Group members may receive a \$100 honorarium per meeting, as well as dinner, for their participation and contribution. Meetings may be held in a hybrid format so that Members can be located anywhere.



Dear TFN members and residents:

This is a reminder that Stage 1 watering restrictions will be in effect from May 1 until October 15, 2024 as outlined in *Metro Vancouver's Drinking Water Conservation Plan*.

<u>https://metrovancouver.org/services/water/Documents/drinking-water-conservation-plan.pdf</u> Stage 1 comes into effect automatically each year to manage the use of drinking water during periods of high demand, water shortages, and emergencies.

Reducing lawn watering remains the most effective way to ensure we are using our drinking water wisely during the summer months when demand is highest and rainfall is lowest. One morning per week provides adequate watering time to maintain a healthy lawn and achieve further water use reductions. Watering trees, shrubs and flowers is permitted any day of the week.

Successful conservation across the region will help us to continue to deliver drinking water to the increasing number of people who call Metro Vancouver home. Additionally, sustainable lawn care and landscaping practices can help residents prepare for changing weather patterns, to continue to enjoy their green spaces.
