SCHEDULE 13 – TFN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION ("TEDC")

The Legislature of Tsawwassen First Nation enacts as follows:

Citation

1 This Act may be cited as the *Appropriations Act 2019*

Definitions

2 In this Act:

"fiscal year" means April 1 of 2019 to March 31 of 2020.

Appropriations for 2019-2020

- 3 (1) The director of finance is authorized to pay the amounts outlined in schedules 1 through 12 of this Act from the Tsawwassen First Nation general revenue fund for the purposes outlined in each schedule.
 - (2) The director of finance is authorized to transfer the amount outlined in schedule 13 to the TFN Economic Development Corporation for its operating expenditures.

Revenues for 2019-2020

The Tsawwassen First Nation Government's estimated revenues and anticipated revenue sources for the fiscal year are set out in Appendices 1 and 2 of this Act.
