Authority

1 This regulation is made under the Land Act.

Definitions

- 2 (1) In this regulation,
 - "Act" means the Land Act.
 - (2) Unless specifically provided otherwise in these regulations, the terms used have the same meaning as defined in the Act.

Notice of and meeting about amendments

- 3 (1) If the Tsawwassen Legislature, by resolution, approves of proposed amendments to the Act submitted to the Legislature by the Executive Council under section 60 [Preparation of proposed amendments] of the Act and the Tsawwassen Legislature has, in the resolution, stipulated that the proposed amendments are not required to be subject to a referendum or a vote of Eligible Voters, then the Executive Council must provide 30 days notice in advance of a meeting of Tsawwassen Members that is convened to discuss the proposed amendments.
 - (2) Notice of the meeting must be
 - (a) posted on the Tsawwassen website,
 - (b) published in the community newsletter, or
 - (c) sent to each Eligible Voter.

Purpose of meeting

The purpose of a meeting referred to in section 3 (1) is to solicit the input of Tsawwassen Members in respect of the proposed amendments.

Reporting of community input

- 5 (1) At a community meeting held under section 3 (1), the chief administrative officer or a designate must record the community's input and must table a report that includes a summary of the input for consideration by Executive Council at a meeting following the community meeting held under section 3 (1).
 - (2) Upon considering the community input, the Executive Council may introduce a bill to amend the Land Act into the Tsawwassen Legislature.
