TSAWWASSEN FIRST NATION, as represented by Tsawwassen Government

("Tsawwassen First Nation")

OF THE THIRD PART

WHEREAS:

Tsawwassen First Nation, Canada, and British Columbia have entered into the Tsawwassen First Nation Final Agreement ("the Final Agreement"), which provides that, on its Effective Date, the

implementation plan will be established to guide the Parties on the implementation of the Final Agreement.

THEREFORE THE PARTIES AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING AS THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN:

1.0 GENERAL

- 1.1 This implementation plan is required by chapter 25 of the Final Agreement.
- 1.2 The purpose of the implementation plan is to assist the Parties to implement the Final Agreement.

2.0 INTERPRETATION AND LEGAL STATUS

- 2.1 The implementation plan:
 - a. does not form part of the Final Agreement;
 - b. is not a treaty or land claims agreement;
 - c. does not recognize or affirm aboriginal or treaty rights within the meaning of section 25 or 35 of the *Constitution* Act, *1982*;
 - d. does not create legal obligations;
 - e. does not alter any rights or obligations set out in the Final Agreement;
 - f. does not preclude any Party from asserting that rights or obligations exist under the Final Agreement; and
 - g. is not to be used to interpret the Final Agreement.
- 2.2 Words and phrases defined in the Final Agreement have the same meaning in the implementation plan, unless the context indicates otherwise.
- 2.3 The English version of this plan is the authoritative version.

3.0 COMMENCEMENT AND TERM

3.1 The implementation plan comes into effect on the Effective Date of the Final Agreement and is for a term of ten years unless renewed or extended by the Parties on the recommendation of the implementation committee.

4.0 CONTENTS OF THE PLAN

4.1 The implementation plan is made up of the following:

Tsawwassen First Nation Implementation Plan

- a. Preamble; and
- b. Worksheets that identify the obligations and set out the activities required to implement the provisions in the Final Agreement, the responsible Party or Parties and the timelines for the activities and obligations (Schedule A).

5.0 AMENDMENT AND RENEWAL

- 5.1 Schedule A of the implementation plan may be amended by the Parties by agreement on the recommendation of the Implementation Committee.
- 5.2 The Parties may by agreement renew or extend the Implementation Plan beyond its initial term.


