



## Consultation Notice

### Pest Management Plan (PMP) Renewal

PMP Number: TFN-PMP-2026/2031

The Tsawwassen First Nation (TFN) is renewing its Pest Management Plan and will submit it for approval under the Integrated Pest Management Act. This plan outlines a Mosquito Control Program that uses Integrated Pest Management (IPM) methods, including the targeted use of insecticides.

### Purpose

Mosquito control for the purpose of nuisance reduction.

### Application Method

Hand-treatment of mosquito larval development sites.

### Location

This Pest Management Plan applies to bodies of water on public and private lands within TFN boundaries as defined by the TFN Final Agreement (effective April 3, 2009).

Mosquito development varies depending on:

- Tidal height and frequency along the shoreline
- Precipitation levels affecting inland areas

### Pesticides

Yearly treatment limits (not to exceed the following totals):

- Up to 100 ha with Vectobac 200 G (PCP No. 18158)
- *Bacillus thuringiensis* var. *israelensis*





- Up to 100 ha with Vectolex CG (PCP No. 28008)
- Bacillus sphaericus strain 2362 – 50 BsITU/mg
- Up to 100 ha with Vectobac FG+ (PCP No. 34734)
- Bacillus thuringiensis var. israelensis

## Notes:

- Products were selected to target mosquito populations in an environmentally responsible manner.
- All insecticides are registered for mosquito control in Canada.
- Bacillus thuringiensis products are target-specific, non-residual, and non-toxic.
- TFN will choose the lowest-impact option and will not treat the full maximum area for all products.
