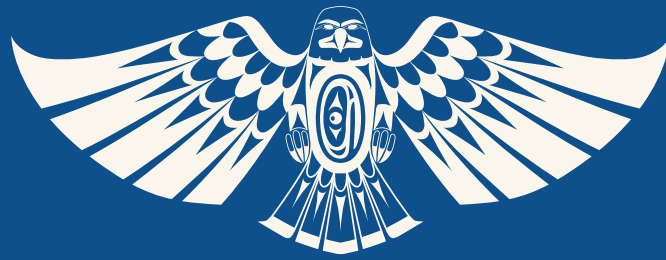

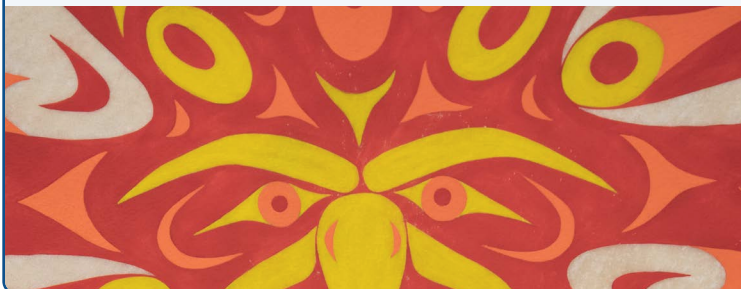

Sturgeon Carcass Drift Study: Vessel Opportunity

OPPORTUNITY TO SERVE ON TFN'S JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Executive Council is seeking TFN Member applicants for a vacancy on the Judicial Council. The TFN Judicial Council is appointed by Executive Council to 5-year terms, pursuant to the Administrative Review and Judicial Proceedings Act. The TFN Member position on the Judicial Council recently became vacant when the Member who was appointed to the position in 2024 stepped down after accepting a staff position within the TFN Administration as they were no longer eligible to serve on the Council.

The Judicial Council meets as required, in accordance with the instructions of the Chair of the Judicial Council, and has the following responsibilities:

- determining the validity of Tsawwassen laws,
- resolving disputes between Tsawwassen Members and elected officials,
- making recommendations to courts on the sentencing of Tsawwassen Members,
- if requested, investigating any financial irregularities that may occur,
- hearing appeals of administrative decisions, resolving disputes between Tsawwassen Members,
- resolving disputes between government bodies, and
- other duties that Executive Council may assign to it from time to time under any Tsawwassen enactment.

The hourly rate of pay for the TFN Member appointee is \$75 per hour.

All TFN Members are eligible to apply, however you may not concurrently sit on Judicial Council and hold any other office with Tsawwassen Government or collect fees or a salary from Tsawwassen Government.

RFQ Election Officer Services

Tsawwassen First Nation (TFN) is a proud Coast Salish nation whose land base is located south of the Fraser River along the Salish Sea. We are a self-governing modern treaty First Nation under the terms of a Final Agreement that became effective in 2009. Currently TFN has approximately 350 Members of voting age – this includes Members who live away from Tsawwassen Lands in Canada and the USA, who will require mail-in and online voting options.

TFN is seeking quotes for the services of an Election Officer for the next Tsawwassen General Election occurring on Saturday October 17th, 2026. In accordance with section 7 of the TFN Elections Act (2025), the Election Officer must have the knowledge and experience to conduct an election, cannot be a Tsawwassen Member, and cannot be an employee of Tsawwassen First Nation or an employee of a Tsawwassen Institution. The duties of the Election Officer include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Receiving and confirming nominations, and vetting candidates for eligibility
- Preparing and posting a voters list
- Organizing Nomination and All-Candidates meetings
- Preparing, distributing and receiving mail-in ballots
- Managing in-person voting and counting of ballots
- Managing online voting including the set-up and configuration of an online voting platform
- Preparing a report on election results
- Compiling and delivering an election manual upon completion of the election

TFN's Elections Act (2025) is available to view on our website tsawwassenfirstnation.com/governance-overview/laws Please note that the Regulations currently listed on the website are due to be replaced, and we anticipate that new Regulations will be approved by July 2nd 2026. Applicants can request draft versions of the new Regulations for review by contacting Jennifer Jansen (see below).

Expression of Interest: Sidney Spit Ferry and Water Taxi Services Overview

Parks Canada has advised that it is planning a change to the current operational model for the Sidney Spit ferry service. While there are two years remaining on the existing service contract, Parks Canada intends to transition to a business license model at the conclusion of that term.

Proposed Change

Under the new business license model, operators would be granted greater flexibility with respect to:

- Vessel size and type
- Ticket pricing and service structure

The objective of this change is to create more adaptable operating conditions and to support the development of sustainable and profitable ferry or water taxi businesses servicing Sidney Spit.

Upcoming Opportunity

Parks Canada will be issuing a call for expressions of interest from businesses that wish to operate ferry or water taxi services between Sidney and Sidney Spit under this new model.

TFN Treaty Periodic Review

Phase 1 of the TFN Treaty Periodic Review Has Begun

Tsawwassen First Nation is beginning Phase 1 of the Periodic Review, a process built into the TFN Treaty that allows TFN, BC, and Canada to review and improve how the Treaty works over time.

This notice is for information only. No decisions are being made at this stage.

What Is the Periodic Review?

It is a regular, collaborative process that keeps the Treaty a living agreement—one that continues to reflect the needs of TFN Members today and into the future. This is not a reopening of the Treaty, and any potential updates occur through negotiation, not the courts.

Why This Matters

The Treaty remains an integral part of TFN's success, supporting strong self-government, stable governance, and long-term Nation-building. The Periodic Review is an opportunity to strengthen what is already working and make practical improvements that support TFN's future generations.

What Is Phase 1?

Phase 1 focuses on early, targeted improvements where TFN, BC, and Canada are already aligned. These discussions are preliminary and centred on clarity and good governance.

What's Next?


More information will be shared as the process unfolds, including website and social media updates, text notifications, a detailed Social Pinpoint information page, and spring engagement sessions for learning and questions.

TFN is committed to providing clear, transparent updates throughout the process.

Aging at Home

Grounds Maintenance & Snow Removal Program

This program supports Tsawwassen Elders — and Members with health limitations — to live safely and comfortably at home by helping with grounds maintenance and snow removal within the TFN Community Area.

Services Included:

Grounds Maintenance

- Grass cutting
- Minor landscaping for safety and aging in place
- Delivered by TFN or by an outside provider (with reimbursement)

Snow Removal

- Provided only by TFN or TFN's contractor
- No reimbursement for private snow removal services

WHO CAN APPLY?

Elders

- TFN Members 55+ living in their primary residence on TFN Lands.
- Eligible for up to \$2,500/year in grounds maintenance support (per residence).
- Snow removal is automatically provided by TFN after 5 cm of snowfall.

Non-Elders (Exceptional Circumstances)

- Members with health limitations preventing them from doing yard work may apply.
- Must show they cannot complete the work themselves.

Not Eligible

- Major landscaping, renovations, or minor home repairs
- (these fall under other TFN programs).
- Cleaning or removal of personal items (toys, vehicles, pools, waste, animal feces).
- Any service the Director deems ineligible.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Submit a completed application form to the Director of Municipal Infrastructure.

- Applications processed first-come, first-served.
- Include:
 - Type of work needed
 - Desired frequency (if TFN provides the service)
 - Any additional info requested

Aging at Home – Cont.

Grounds Maintenance & Snow Removal Program Additional Info

WAITING LIST

- If the program is full, eligible applicants are placed on a waitlist.
- Applicants must respond within 10 business days when contacted.

HOW PAYMENTS WORK

Option 1: TFN-Delivered Service

- TFN or its contractor completes the work directly.
- No reimbursement for services completed by TFN.

Option 2: Reimbursement

- Applies only to grounds maintenance (not snow removal).
- Eligible for reimbursement for services completed on or after April 1, 2026.
- Must provide:
 - Proof of payment
 - Evidence the work was completed
- Reimbursement available for up to 2 years after service date.

Renewals

- If TFN provides your ongoing service, you do not need to reapply each year.
- Members must keep their contact information up to date and notify TFN if their circumstances change.

MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Ensure yards are free of hazards or obstacles (including dog feces) before service.
- TFN may refuse service until hazards are removed.

Heavy-Duty Clean Hydrogen Station Opens on TFN Lands

HTEC is honoured to announce the opening of Canada's first 700 bar commercial heavy-duty clean hydrogen refueling station, located on Tsawwassen First Nation (TFN) lands.

This milestone would not have been possible without the leadership, guidance, and partnership of Tsawwassen First Nation. HTEC extends its sincere gratitude to TFN for welcoming this project to their lands and for working alongside us with a shared commitment to sustainability, economic opportunity, and respect for the land.

Designed to support the growing adoption of hydrogen in heavy-duty transportation and port operations, the station is part of HTEC's expanding Metro Vancouver Hydrogen Transportation Hub and is supplied with clean hydrogen from HTEC's Burnaby production facility. Operating at 700 bar, the station supports longer driving range and faster, more efficient refueling for fuel cell trucks, capabilities that are essential for real-world freight operations.

Throughout the project, HTEC was grateful to work closely with TFN departments, community members, and local vendors, ensuring the work reflected TFN values and priorities. We are also honoured to have collaborated with TFN artists Karl Morgan, Tabitha Adams, Kaitlin Williams, Vincent Morgan, and Sarah Lang. Their artwork on the station building highlights the importance of protecting land and water and stands as a lasting reflection of TFN's connection to this territory.

HTEC thanks Chief Cassidy and Ryan Daum for their station opening remarks, and the Tsawwassen First Nation councillors and members for joining us at the event. We are proud to work alongside TFN in building a cleaner energy future for all.

Did you know?

The hydrogen-powered trucks that fuel at this station produce only water vapour from their tailpipes!
