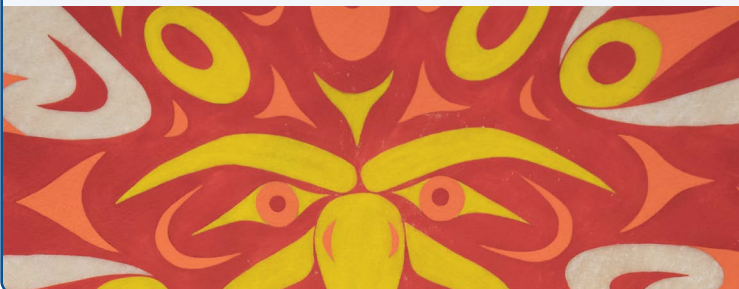

Sturgeon Carcass Drift Study: Vessel Opportunity

Tsawwassen First Nation, in association with LGL Limited environmental research associates, is conducting a study to better understand the detectability of sturgeon carcasses in the Fraser River. Last summer we collected 4 sturgeon carcasses found on the Fraser River. This summer we will defrost the fish and insert tags to track their movement through the river. We will release the fish in 4 different locations on 4 different days.

Economic Development

Expression of Interest: Sidney Spit Ferry and Water Taxi Services Overview

Parks Canada has advised that it is planning a change to the current operational model for the Sidney Spit ferry service. While there are two years remaining on the existing service contract, Parks Canada intends to transition to a business license model at the conclusion of that term.

Proposed Change

Under the new business license model, operators would be granted greater flexibility with respect to:

- Vessel size and type
- Ticket pricing and service structure

The objective of this change is to create more adaptable operating conditions and to support the development of sustainable and profitable ferry or water taxi businesses servicing Sidney Spit.

Upcoming Opportunity

Parks Canada will be issuing a call for expressions of interest from businesses that wish to operate ferry or water taxi services between Sidney and Sidney Spit under this new model.

TFN Treaty Periodic Review

Phase 1 of the TFN Treaty Periodic Review Has Begun

Tsawwassen First Nation is beginning Phase 1 of the Periodic Review, a process built into the TFN Treaty that allows TFN, BC, and Canada to review and improve how the Treaty works over time.

This notice is for information only. No decisions are being made at this stage.

What Is the Periodic Review?

It is a regular, collaborative process that keeps the Treaty a living agreement—one that continues to reflect the needs of TFN Members today and into the future. This is not a reopening of the Treaty, and any potential updates occur through negotiation, not the courts.

Why This Matters

The Treaty remains an integral part of TFN's success, supporting strong self-government, stable governance, and long-term Nation-building. The Periodic Review is an opportunity to strengthen what is already working and make practical improvements that support TFN's future generations.

What Is Phase 1?

Phase 1 focuses on early, targeted improvements where TFN, BC, and Canada are already aligned. These discussions are preliminary and centred on clarity and good governance.

What's Next?

More information will be shared as the process unfolds, including website and social media updates, text notifications, a detailed Social Pinpoint information page, and spring engagement sessions for learning and questions.

TFN is committed to providing clear, transparent updates throughout the process.

DETAILS

The GCT Future of Nations Scholarship for Indigenous Students program provides annual scholarships to members of Indigenous Nations whose treaty and traditional territories intersect with GCT operations.

This scholarship awards one (1) scholarship valued at **\$2,500.00** to a Tsawwassen First Nation Member who demonstrates strong academic performance and/or a strong desire to learn, advance skills, strengthen cultural knowledge, or pursue personal and community growth. Consideration is also given to community involvement, and leadership qualities. GCT recognizes that learning and leadership take many forms, including cultural knowledge sharing, language revitalization, community mentorship, traditional practices, and non-traditional education pathways.

Aging at Home

Grounds Maintenance & Snow Removal Program

This program supports Tsawwassen Elders — and Members with health limitations — to live safely and comfortably at home by helping with grounds maintenance and snow removal within the TFN Community Area.

Services Included:

Grounds Maintenance

- Grass cutting
- Minor landscaping for safety and aging in place
- Delivered by TFN or by an outside provider (with reimbursement)

Snow Removal

- Provided only by TFN or TFN's contractor
- No reimbursement for private snow removal services



WHO CAN APPLY?

Elders

- TFN Members 55+ living in their primary residence on TFN Lands.
- Eligible for up to \$2,500/year in grounds maintenance support (per residence).
- Snow removal is automatically provided by TFN after 5 cm of snowfall.

Non-Elders (Exceptional Circumstances)

- Members with health limitations preventing them from doing yard work may apply.
- Must show they cannot complete the work themselves.

Not Eligible

- Major landscaping, renovations, or minor home repairs
- (these fall under other TFN programs).
- Cleaning or removal of personal items (toys, vehicles, pools, waste, animal feces).
- Any service the Director deems ineligible.



APPLICATION PROCESS

Submit a completed application form to the Director of Municipal Infrastructure.

- Applications processed first-come, first-served.
- Include:
 - Type of work needed
 - Desired frequency (if TFN provides the service)
 - Any additional info requested

Grounds Maintenance & Snow Removal Program

Additional Info

WAITING LIST

- If the program is full, eligible applicants are placed on a waitlist.
- Applicants must respond within 10 business days when contacted.

HOW PAYMENTS WORK

Option 1: TFN-Delivered Service

- TFN or its contractor completes the work directly.
- No reimbursement for services completed by TFN.

Option 2: Reimbursement

- Applies only to grounds maintenance (not snow removal).
- Eligible for reimbursement for services completed on or after April 1, 2026.
- Must provide:
- Proof of payment
- Evidence the work was completed
- Reimbursement available for up to 2 years after service date.

Renewals

- If TFN provides your ongoing service, you do not need to reapply each year.
- Members must keep their contact information up to date and notify TFN if their circumstances change.

MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Ensure yards are free of hazards or obstacles (including dog feces) before service.
- TFN may refuse service until hazards are removed.

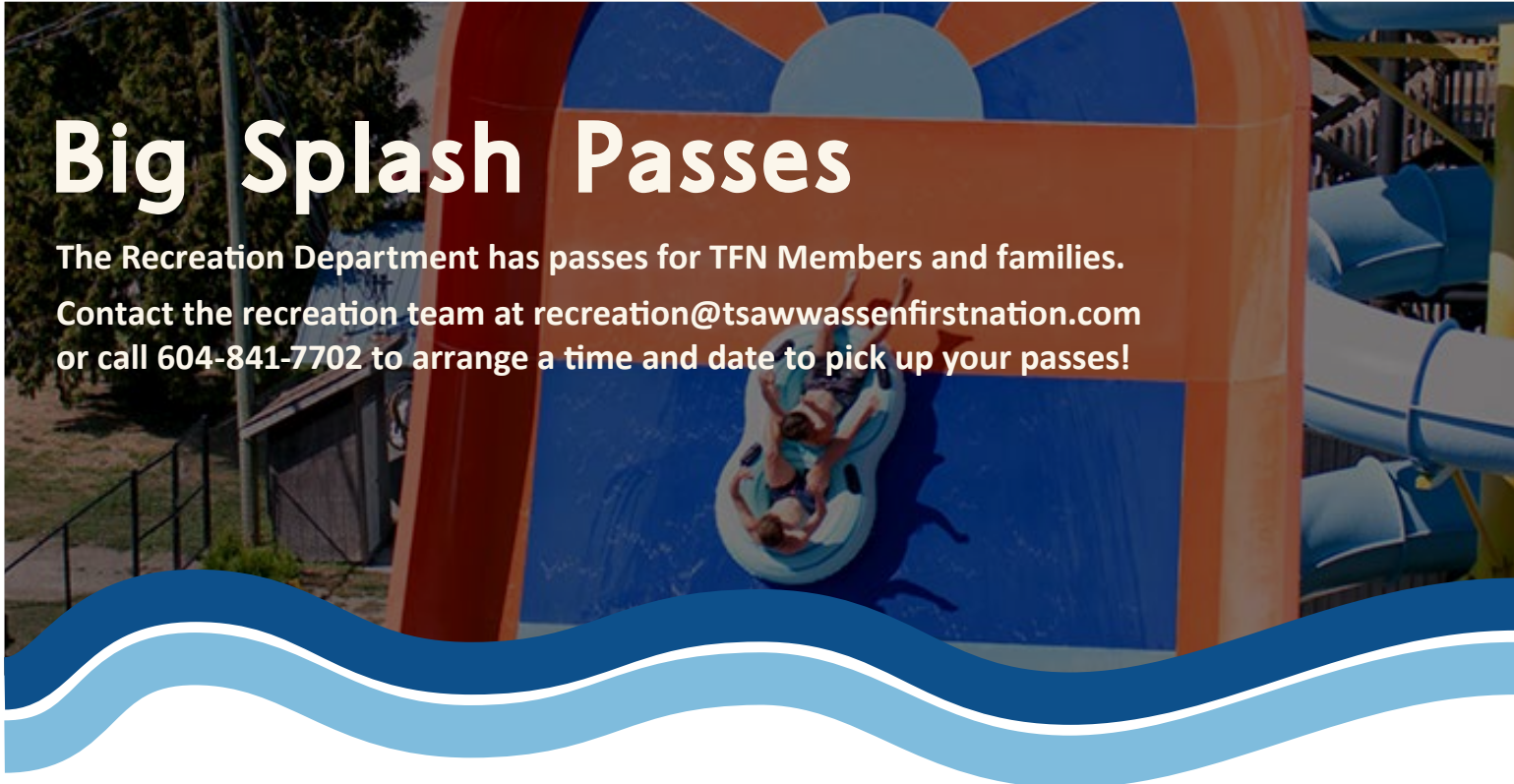

Member Responsibilities

- Enter into a lease agreement with TFN Ec Dev.
- Pay \$25 monthly rate per stall.
- Members are responsible for maintaining the site, ensuring no environmental harm. As such, we cannot accommodate aggregates, soils, or hazardous materials on site.
- All activities must adhere to TFN laws and regulations, including the TFN Good Neighbour Regulation.

Coyote Safety



Recently coyotes have been seen around TFN and surrounding areas, to deter coyotes and keep everyone and their animals safe here are some tips you can use:

- **Eliminate attractants**

Coyotes are opportunistic feeders. If your yard provides easy meals or a place to hunt, they will return.

- **Secure food waste:** always lock your garbage bins with secure latches or use wildlife-resistant containers.
- **Pet food and water:** Never leave pet food, water, or bowls outside.
- **Yard management:** Clear dense brush, tall grass, wood piles. These provide perfect cover for coyotes to hunt rodents.
- **Clean up:** Pick up fallen fruit from trees and avoid leaving grass and food scraps on BBQ grills.

- **Physical Barriers**

To physically block coyotes from entering your yard or accessing vulnerable livestock, secure boundaries are highly effective.

- **Fencing**
 - **Light and Sound (Scare Tactics)**

Sudden unfamiliar surprises can frighten coyotes away from specific areas on your property

- **Motion Activated Devices:** Set up motion sensor flood lights.
- **Noise Makers:** Devices that emit high-frequency ultrasonic sounds, flashing red lights (such as Predator eye PRO nighttime Repellants), or sudden audible alarms help keep territories unstable and risky for coyotes.

- **Active Hazing**

If a coyote wanders into your yard or approaches you while you are walking, you must assert dominance, so they associate humans with danger.

- **The "BIG Routine":** make yourself large or use items like an umbrella or jacket.
- **Be Loud:** Clap your hands, Shout, use a whistle
- **While walking:** Keep your dog on a short leash (under 6 Ft) If coyotes continues to approach and act aggressively, pick up your small dogs and back away slowly

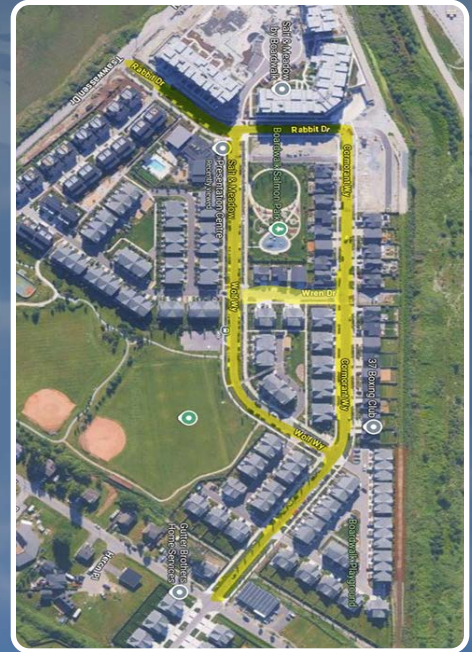
